Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- When we were open we had a very thorough risk assessment in place which allowed us to utilise as much PE as possible e.g. Y5/6 played tennis in Dalston in the Autumn 1st term, some classes were able to attend Morton for gymnastics, some classes were able to attend Carlisle Pools for swimming lessons.</li> <li>- We have really focused on improving our outdoor area this year to enable our children to engage in regular physical activity at break and lunch times.</li> <li>- We entered 3 teams into the Virtual Key Steps Gymnastics competition. KS1 and KS2 came 2nd in the local competition.
